203.2 ORDER OF THE REGULAR SCHOOL BOARD MEETING

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to ensure consistency in the order of business at regular school board meetings.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

It is the policy of the school board to consider matters that come before it in a consistent and orderly manner.

III. ORDER

- A. The school board shall conduct an orderly school board meeting. The school board will, at all regular school board meetings, follow an agenda order similar to:
1. Call to order and pledge of allegiance
 2. Roll Call
 3. Mission statement
 4. Agenda approval/adjustments, announcements, correspondence

 5. Communications to the Board
 6. Consent agenda
 7. Acknowledgment of Contributions
 8. Discussion, reports, information items
 9. Action items
 10. Board topics
 11. Adjourn
