Columbia Academy News Home Visits Build Helpful Connections

This past week, all CA teachers received training in the National Parent Teachers Home Visit project. We believe home visits help our teachers and parents gain knowledge that can help students be more successful in



school. Home Visits are one way that teachers and families can make stronger connections. Here are some parameters of the Home Visit project:

- Home visits are voluntary for both families and teachers; teachers reach out through a
 phone call to see if and when they can come to visit
- Families selected for Home Visits are a random draw; there is no criteria used to identify a family for a home visit.
- There are two visits to each family, one in the fall to get to know each other and one in the spring to go over important information regarding the child's education.

We are excited to have all of our teachers trained so that we can begin visiting families this spring. Our hope is that every teacher will have the experience of doing at least one home visit. If you get a phone from a teacher requesting a home visit, please know this is a very positive opportunity.



MCA Growth Goals

Please be talking to your child about the importance of performing at their very best on the upcoming MCAs. Growth goals have been set based on their performance last year and the work they have completed this year. Here are three important reasons for students to give their best effort:

- MCAs are used to help determine which students need additional support including summer school and other interventions
- MCAs show how your child is performing relative to other students across the state in the same grade level
- MCAs show how much growth your child is making on an annual basis.
 The MCAs can help you gauge your child's level of effort in school.
