

AVID Comes to CA

Advancement via Individual Determination (AVID) is an international system that helps prepare students for the rigors of college and career. AVID has a very strong record across the country of helping students graduate from high school and go on to college. This year our 6th graders will be involved in AVID programming in their classes. Our hope is that in a few years, our entire school will be AVID. In fact, some of our school-wide work already reflects our commitment to utilize proven strategies from AVID. This includes the use of binders and planners

to organize students and communicate with parents, the promotion of a college readiness message through college banners and teachers talking about their college experience, and through transforming school culture to focus on rigorous academics.

We are excited to have the opportunity to learn from schools across the country who are building middle schools that promote a path to college readiness. Columbia Academy will use AVID to build college and career readiness.





A Culture of Academics

We define a culture of academics as students and teachers working within rigorous classrooms with serious intent to improve learning. High expectations mean that time is not wasted and that distractions are not tolerated. The excitement of dynamic learning results in students describing their classrooms as interesting and fun. Teachers are working this year to provide high structure while building a sense of community in their classrooms. Students who have difficulty engaging in learning will be provided with support so that they can also benefit from being in a school that takes learning very seriously. Above all else, we want your child to be successful.

In order to make this happen, we are increasing our attention on both incentives and appropriate intervention. Incentives this year will include the opportunity to qualify to participate in fun events and the possibility to earn CA Cash to be used to buy items in our CA Store. Interventions will include lunchtime and afterschool detention time that will be used to help students change habits that interfere with learning. Finally, we will include direct instruction of social/emotional skills and provide intensive adult support for students with the greatest needs.

We know that changing culture takes time and is not always an easy task but it is essential for the good of your child and that of our school as a whole. We welcome your feedback and ask for your support in helping students see the importance of school being a place to learn.

100% one to one tablets

This is the first year that every student at Columbia Academy has his/her own tablet. Students spent the second of week of school learning and practicing digital citizenship. Last week, students started receiving their tablets and will begin carrying them to each class in their backpack. In order to make sure students are bringing their devices to school and that they are fully powered for the day, devices will remain at school overnight. Using technology to learn is an important 21st century life skill that we will emphasize with our students this year.



CA Athletics Update

We are proud of our Columbia Academy athletes and coaches who practice hard each week in order to compete with strength and respect in their quest for excellence. Some highlights include:

- Girls volleyball are 3-0 under the guidance of Coach Anderson. Ms. Anderson is also a PE teacher at CA.
- Boys soccer defeated Fridley 8-1 last week and are coached by CA PE instructor Scott Opatz.
- The football team has had several hard fought games with a big win over St.
 Anthony under the lights at CHHS Stadium. Coach Howe and Coach Laskowski both work at CA..Mr. Howe is in charge of the CA behavior room and Mr. Laskowski is a CA Social Studies teacher. They are assisted by Coach Sheets.
- Columbia Academy students are also currently participating with high school students in competitive tennis, bowling, as well as girls' soccer and swimming. Go
