Mid-Quarter grades

Minnesota Student Survey

The Minnesota Student Survey is conducted every three years with 5th, 8th, 9th, and 11th grade students across the state. The survey asks questions about activities, experiences, and behaviors. Topics covered include tobacco, alcohol and drug use, school climate, physical activity, violence and safety, connections with school and family, health, and other topics. Questions about sexual activity are asked only of high school students. The survey is administered jointly by the Minnesota Departments of Education, Health, Human Services, and Public Safety. Columbia Academy 8th graders will be doing the survey which is approximately 45 minutes long on Friday, January
