

### **HUGS: Part of every day at CA**

We insist on reading at Columbia Academy because it is the foundation for all learning and essential to ensure academic success. All of our classrooms are devoting time and energy into helping all our students become better readers by teaching close reading strategies. Regardless of the subject, expect students to read in all our classrooms and use strategies such as HUGS (Highlight, Underline, Gloss, Summarize) in order to better understand text.

Being able to read and understand grade level text is essential to future success. Building knowledge across content areas provides context for understanding. Our teachers help students gain background knowledge through the teaching of key vocabulary words.



Our Media Specialist works hard to make sure all students also have books they can read in and out of school. We want students to read at least 20 minutes per day.

We insist on reading because it is a great key to a bright future, as well as just plain fun!
