

Columbia Heights Public Schools Expands Youth Sports Offerings

Columbia Heights Public Schools (CHPS) is excited to expand its summer youth sports offerings for students in grades 4-12. Each summer, students are invited to participate in a wide range of activities led by our District coaches and staff.

K-12 Activities Manager Jake Henderson and Community Education Coordinator Jodi Gadient collaborated on programming to ensure students have opportunities to develop their athletic skills and improve their fitness. Camps are offered for a fee with scholarships available.

"I'm excited for all of our offerings this summer," said Henderson. "There will be many opportunities to build sport specific skills, get stronger and stay connected this summer."

A new addition to this year's sport camps is the "Run Club." Other camps include swim & dive, soccer, basketball, football, volleyball, dance and lacrosse. Strength training is also offered to students in grades 7-12 at no cost through the 21st Century Community Learning Center (21CCLC) grant.

A new offering for younger students is the FREE "Summer Sampler" -- also available through the 21CCLC program.

"The Summer Sampler will give students in grades 4-6 an opportunity to sample sports offered at the secondary level here in CHPS," said Gadient. "Participants will spend four days each sampling dance, soccer, football, synchronized swimming, volleyball, basketball, track & field, and swim & dive."

Henderson described the Sampler as a great opportunity for students to learn fundamentals, skills, and play fun games with high school coaches and student athletes.

The District will continue to follow the most up-to-date COVID-19 safety guidance from the Minnesota Department of Health and the Minnesota State High School League.

The State of Minnesota requires that driver's education distance learning be conducted in a face-to-face platform, which requires that students have a video camera and audio capabilities on their devices. Safeway has chosen a secure Zoom platform to conduct the class. Safeway will email the classroom handouts and MN Driver's Manual in PDF format for printing. Students will be required to be in front of the camera and interactive for the full three-hour class.

Parents/guardians will be required to complete Safeway's Account Verification. Safeway will send out an email before class begins that gives detailed information about how to login to the student's Safeway account to verify and complete contact information and to review and acknowledge our Service Agreement.














Columbia Heights Public Schools Unveils North Park School for Innovation A 'New' Era for North Park Focused on STEM, Creativity, Sustainability

Columbia Heights Public Schools is proud to unveil North Park School for Innovation, a PreK 4-grade 5 building with a focus on STEM, creativity and sustainability.

"We are thrilled to reintroduce the newly rebranded North Park School for Innovation to the community," said Superintendent Zena Stenvik. "The process of creating a STEM-focused school was truly a whole community endeavor. We appreciate everyone's efforts that led us to this moment of celebration. We have established a multi-year implementation plan that includes local partnerships, strong educational foundation and amazing opportunities for students to learn, grow and thrive."

The comprehensive rebranding efforts came after the school, formerly North Park Elementary, underwent extensive renovations following voter approval of the 2018 Bond Referendum.

The improvements completed addressed the school's building security and educational needs to be comparable with other schools in the District and area including:

- A secure single point of entry for all visitors.
- School offices located at the new entrance, which provide enhanced security and customer service.
- A separate entrance and exit specifically for buses, separating the buses from the playground, and a new entry/exit and parking lot for other vehicles, enhancing the safety and security of daily activities at the school.
- Updated early childhood and kindergarten space that facilitate innovative hands-on learning programs.
- Improved learning spaces for science, art, media arts and a school library.
- Improved learning spaces to support our students receiving Special Education programming.
- The cafeteria separated from the gymnasium.

A 30-person, Blue Ribbon Advisory Task Force – made up of parents, students, North Park teachers and staff, District staff and representatives from Highland Elementary, Valley View Elementary and Columbia Academy – was assembled in 2019 to review and analyze data for various school models. The Task Force reviewed each of the following models, including the number of such schools in the metro area, and their success and demographics: Environmental Science, Montessori, Spanish Immersion, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) and the option to maintain a traditional school.

The Task Force made their formal recommendation to redefine North Park as a STEM school to the School Board last June. Curriculum is aligned to coursework at Columbia Academy and Columbia Heights High School.

As part of North Park's reimagination, stakeholders constructed five guiding principle statements that help illustrate the school's new identity:

- Our learners unlock their potential through a strong academic foundation.
- Our learners use science and the design thinking process to develop new solutions.
- Our learners create an environmentally-sustainable community.
- Our learners discover their passion through creativity.
- Our learners see challenges as an opportunity for growth.

"If you had to pick one word [to best describe] North Park, it is 'innovation,'" said Principal Jeff Cacek. Columbia Heights High School Student Wins State Poetry Out Loud Competition

Columbia Heights High School (CHHS) ENCORE Poetry Club Sophomore Sophie Kuether won first place in the state Poetry Out Loud competition – a nationwide poetry recitation contest.

Kuether recited "April Love" by Ernest Dowson, "To Have Without Holding" by Marge Piercy and "I Think I Should Have Loved You Presently" by Edna St. Vincent Millay. Her win was announced at a virtual awards ceremony Thursday, March II via Zoom hosted by South Central Service Cooperative. Just ten students were chosen from across the state to compete virtually. CHHS was the only school who had more than one student advance to the state competition. Junior Danquyen Le also competed.

"When I found out I won the state competition, I think my house probably starting shaking because I was screaming so loud and jumping all around," said Kuether about her win. "I chose my pieces because they felt like they had the raw emotion about the different ways love can make you feel."

Chris Polley, who leads the ENCORE Poetry Club says he's incredibly proud of Sophie and all the CHHS students in Poetry Club that competed in the competition this year.

"Having a student become a state champion during the pandemic is a testament to the coping powers of poetry and the supportive community we formed this year to discuss and share poetry with each other," he said. "I wish Sophie the best of luck at the national competition and I'm excited to see her represent our school and city as well as the state of Minnesota alongside the other 51 state winners."

"The thing I like most about poetry is the different interpretations and reads you can get off of just one piece," Kuether noted. "I have been working with three poems for a few months now and I still feel like I'm finding out new things about them. My pages of poetry are completely scribbled on in the margins as I discover new things about these complicated pieces, and yet they were still as beautiful as the first time I read them."

The virtual nature of this year's competition required students to create and submit video recordings of their recitations instead of performing them live. Students had to pick two poems from the Poetry Out Loud website: one poem had to be published before 1900, and the other had to be 25 lines or fewer. One of the poems could satisfy both requirements.


