Columbia Heights Public Schools Welcomes New High School Principal

Columbia Heights Public Schools (CHPS) welcomes Todd Wynne as the next Columbia Heights High School (CHHS) Principal. The CHPS Board of Education approved the recommendation of Wynne at its June 8, 2021 Regular School Board Meeting. Wynne began his role July 1, 2021 in which he will work to develop and maintain educational programs which align with increasing academic achievement and creating college and career-ready students.

"[CHPS] is very unique. The District is small, has a strong sense of community, and has robust course offerings and opportunities for all students that you would expect in larger school districts," said Wynne about what drew him to this principalship. "CHHS is rich in tradition and academic success and takes pride in the diverse school population we serve. Throughout the interview process and interactions with the staff and district leadership team I could feel the positive energy and love for kids."

In his role as CHHS Principal, Wynne will be responsible for meeting the diverse academic needs of over 1,000 students in grades 9-12. He will also lead, develop and support approximately 100 staff members.



Wynne comes to the District with over two decades of education experience including both teaching and administrative roles at all levels – elementary, middle and high school.

"I have been a high school social studies teacher, grades K-8 PE teacher, athletic director, dean, assistant principal, and principal," he said of his background. "I was fortunate to work with amazing students, staff, and school communities ranging from a very rural, small town school to one of the largest and most diverse middle schools in the country."

Wynne brings a great philosophy to the District – that all students can learn and have a right to a high-quality education.

"Our role as educators is to meet every student where they are and to support their academic, social, and emotional needs through quality teaching and strong relationships," he said.

"My goal is to help maintain a safe and caring school culture where all students and staff feel like they belong," Wynne noted of what he hopes to achieve at CHHS. "I am driven to ensure students have the tools, resources and confidence to have success after high school. I also understand the importance of creating strong relationships with the elementary and middle schools that feed into CHHS, and want to grow and foster these relationships."

"Principal Wynne comes to us with a great deal of experience as a school leader," said Superintendent Zena Stenvik. "His enthusiasm for CHPS was apparent from the first time we met. He is committed to our district's mission and is sure to form strong connections with our families, students and staff."

Wynne noted families can expect him to be visible, approachable and to always listen.

"I love my job and I hope it shows in all that I do," he said.



Columbia Heights Public Schools Implements Change to Chill™ with new Partnership with Allina Health

Columbia Heights Public Schools (CHPS) has partnered with Allina Health to implement their teen mental well-being program Change to Chill™ (CTC) to its schools for the 2021-2022 school year. Initially, the program was only going to be implemented at the high school, but the District secured a \$10,000 Prairie Care grant to expand CTC to all five schools.

The partnership includes Change to Chill trainings for school staff, tailored communications for parent engagement, funding for a "Chill Zone," and a summer internship opportunity for two students at the high school.



"[Student mental health is a priority]; we need to enhance our response to students in real time by providing tools and resources for staff to implement when students exhibit a crisis," said Director of Special Education John Fry.

First launched during the 2018-2019 school year, the CTC School Partnership provides selected schools with year-long support from Allina Health, centered around student leadership, stress management and mental health training sessions for school staff, outreach and engagement with guardians and a \$1,000 grant to put toward creating a "Chill Zone" – a space created by student interns to de-stress and relax before returning to class.

This year, the focus of school partnership will be to continue meeting the unique needs of schools in their responses to the pandemic. Change to Chill staff are working with students to create new, tailored content, and utilizing its online platform to support distance learning through videos, worksheets, audio meditations and more. Students and teachers also receive support to incorporate different stress management elements into classroom and virtual learning.

"We know when teens have the resources and support to stress less, they are more resilient and able to live fuller and happier lives," said Susan Nygaard, manager of Allina Health's Community Health Improvement. "Change to Chill works as a preventive measure to equip teens with tools and resources to better manage stress and anxiety."

"Providing a CTC space and the strategies associated with the space will enhance what we are able to offer our students. Columbia Heights Public Schools provides students with mental health support that is based on student needs and best practices," Fry noted.


Teaching & Learning Coordinator Named 2020-2021 CHPS Employee of the Year

Columbia Heights Public Schools (CHPS) Research & Assessment Coordinator Disa Fabeck has been named the 2020-2021 Employee of the Year. Fabeck is the twelfth recipient of the award.

"Fabeck exemplifies the mission and core values of CHPS," said Superintendent Zena Stenvik. "She is knowledgeable, customer service oriented and a delight to work with. I appreciate that she approaches her work with a scientific and analytical mindset."

"My first reaction when I heard I had been selected as the Employee of the Year was of gratitude," said Fabeck. "This past year has required a high level of flexibility and collaboration and I have been fortunate to work with a wide variety of staff. CHPS has some of the most creative, solution-seeking staff I have ever been a part of. It is a true honor to receive this recognition among the coworkers I have."

In her coordinator role, Fabeck leads the data analysis to support the Teaching & Learning Department. She is responsible for training staff on test specifications and procedures, coordinates district-wide assessments, serves as the District's liaison to the Minnesota Department of Education and other consortiums with respect to assessment data, and more.



Nominators cited Fabeck as "exemplifying what a strong work ethic really is."

"When Disa comes to assist or lead a meeting, her demeanor and overall outlook on school is positive plus," nominators said. "Disa has welcomed assisting any staff member with Zoom meetings, preparing for testing, and helping with professional development. [She has come through] when all seems futile or lost and has positively approached situations with a glass half full attitude."

Fabeck described how the District's mission statement's inclusion of "all belong, all succeed" resonates with the philosophy she brings to her role. "Every conversation and decision needs to be viewed in conjunction with what is best for our learners. We have talented, intelligent adults working daily to ensure that each and every student and family experience the opportunities and access needed for academic success and enrichment," she said. "My goal in the work that I do is to establish a practice of excellence in equity because our community deserves it."

"There has not been a rock she has not polished to shine blue and gold," nominators noted. "There is not enough space or time to tell of all the great things Disa has done for CHPS."

"Disa's focus on creating opportunities for students in evident in her leadership with Advanced Placement, Gifted, and Assessments," said Director of Teaching & Learning Tara Thukral. "She is dedicated to the students, staff and families of CHPS."

"My favorite thing about working [in CHPS] is the people and the clear, equity-driven mission," Fabeck said. "Student and family voices are encouraged in the decision-making process, staff utilize multiple data points to ensure students are getting exactly what they need to thrive, and the diverse student body is celebrated. It is because of this positive, collaborative climate that I truly enjoy being a Hylander."

This year, 16 nominations were received for the annual recognition. To be eligible for the Employee of the Year award, individuals must be a current employee of the District, have worked at least three full years and not received the recognition before. A committee reviews the nominations and makes a selection based on criteria including work ethic, demonstration of "Heights Pride," exemplary performance and more.



Locals Donate Over \$350,000 in Scholarships to High School Seniors

Community members, along with local donors – representing foundations, businesses, memorials, individuals, and others – donated over \$350,000 in scholarships to 83 Columbia Heights High School (CHHS) seniors at the school's virtual Academic Awards Ceremony this week.

A total of 25 students were named to the "A" Honor Roll and 17 were recognized as Honor Ranking Graduates. A total of 71 students received scholarships valued at \$1,000 or more with 43 seniors presented with two or more scholarships.

Seniors Doua Chee Lee, Raghad Mohammed, Valerie Barrera Estrada, Peyton Thao, Lamee Ibrahim Waday, Modou Dibba, Samsam Mohamoud and Ahmed Ait Daoud were awarded scholarships from Wallin Education Partners. Wallin Education Partners is more than a scholarship, it is a proven college-completion program for high-potential students with financial needs. The organization has been awarding scholarships for 28 years and have helped more than 4,500 students attend and graduate college. They partner with 65 donors who share a passion to make college graduation a reality. Students awarded a Wallin scholarship receive up to \$16,000 over four years.

Seniors Jesus Romero Rivera, Jamyang Dolma, Sol Schindler, Mir Ali, Yasmin Mohamed and Catherine Salto Gonzalez were the recipients of \$12,000 scholarships courtesy of the CHHS Alumni Foundation. The Foundation was established in 1998 and, since its inception, has donated over \$680,000 in scholarships to 90 CHHS students. These scholarships are given in the names of Earl Bakken, Connie Bakken, Gerard and Marianne Herringer, Vern and Nancy Hoium, and John Dudziak.

"On behalf of the entire CHHS community, congratulations to all of the students who received scholarships at this year's academic awards," said Principal Dan Wrobleski. "We share the utmost gratitude and appreciation to all of our donors who continually provide financial support for our students' next education journey."
