CHPS Staff Spotlight

Sarah Durst - Columbia Academy Principal's Administrative Assistant

One thing you may not know about Sarah is that she is an avid runner! She started running in 2018 with the running group, Moms on the Run. When she first started running, the goal was to run a 5K, but since joining the group, Sarah has completed numerous 5Ks, 10Ks, three half marathons and 7 Ragnar Relays! Her first marathon was the New York City Marathon in 2021, then the Grandma's Marathon in June 2022, and she just completed her second New York City Marathon on November 6, 2022. Her running group raises money for the organization EmpowerHER, which is a nonprofit on a mission to empower, support and connect girls and young women who have lost their mothers. They are a nonprofit organization that utilitzes extra fundraising by being a charity bib sponsor for the NYC Marathon. Sarah applied with their charity in 2021 and was selected that year to run on their behalf. She has been a part of the team for two years and has rasied \$8000.





Abby and Jacob Endres - PreK 3 Teaching Assistant and CHHS Girls Tennis Coach

During the school year, you can usually find Abby in the CHPS Family Center working in the PreK 3 classroom. Her husband Jacob is also employed by CHPS as the Head Girls Tennis Coach. But in the summer, they spend a lot of their time outdoors and Up North! They each work at Camp Chippewa, which was established in 1935 and hosts about 150 campers each summer.

As program director, Abby coordinates the camper and staff activity schedules and oversee the session schedules. She also teaches climbing and nature activites. Jacob heads up the canoe tripping program and leads extended wilderness canoe trips in Canada!

Amber Bromley - Highland Elementary Phy. Ed Teacher

When she's not keeping our young Highland students active, Amber is helping out on her family's pumpkin farm: Anoka County Farms! Anoka County Farms is located in Ham Lake, MN on Bunker Lake Blvd. In 2007, her husband and his dad began selling pumpkins and doing hayrides. Since opening, they have added new attractions every year. Anoka County Farms is now a local fall attraction. They sell a variety of pumpkins, squash and gourds. Activities include hayrides, pumpkin painting in the barn, a bounce house, corn pit, pumpkin bowling and much more! There are baby farm animals like chicks, ducklings and bunnies, along with goats and pigs! Amber drives around the tractor in the front of the barrel train. Anoka County Farms is open every year mid-September through the end of October. Make sure to put it on your to-do next fall!





Elizabeth Loper - District-Wide Substitute

Elizabeth is constantly moving around, working at all three elementary schools, but her movement doesn't end there. She is an endurance gravel cyclist and bike commutes to work every day (even in the cold and snow). Elizabeth has been biking for the past 6 years but in 2021 she started riding gravel and racing. Her favorite races are ultraendurance gravel events. These are races that are 100+ miles, they take 10+ hours, and are on a variety of unpaved surfaces. Some of her recent favorites have been Heck of the North and the Filthy50. She loves the challenge of racing in these events and the feeling of finishing something most people won't even start. She has started to document these adventures on her YouTube channel, Beth Bikes.

"I don't win, but there is so much fun in the adventure. The endorphins make all the pain worth it. Runner's high doesn't just apply to runners, bike races get the same feeling. The biking community is something that is so supportive. Here is where I have met some of my best friends."







Columbia Heights High School Senior, Kennedi Dudley, was awarded the National African American Recognition Award because of her outstanding academic performance on several College Board tests.

"Receiving this award gives me peace of mind that now I have a solid chance of getting into the colleges that I want to attend. It feels like a real foot in the door as I apply to colleges that have good programs in medicine, which is what I am thinking of studying in college."

College Board's four recognition programs—National African American Recognition Program, National Hispanic Recognition Program, National Indigenous Recognition Program, and National Rural and Small-Town Recognition Program—award academic honors to underrepresented students. Students who take eligible administrations of the PSAT/NMSQT, PSAT 10, or

AP Exams are considered for awards. Students must also identify as African American/Black, Hispanic/Latinx, Indigenous, or attend high school in a rural area or small town.

Dudley has attended the CHPS district since the beginning of her education, starting at Highland Elementary, continuing at Columbia Academy and is now at Columbia Heights High School where she participates in Volleyball, Gymnastics and Track & Field.

"Attending CHPS has been such great preparation for me as I prepare to go off to college. It has been a place where I have been challenged but also CHPS students really have a chance to have a more personal and supportive relationship with teachers and school administration. It is like being in a family."
