#### A Letter from Superintendent Stenvik

Dear Community Members,

As we begin the new school year, we are excited to welcome students of all ages to our educational and enrichment programs. In November 2023, voters will be asked to approve two referendum questions. One question seeks an increase to our Operating Levy for the day-to-day operations of educating our students. This Operating Levy has not increased in 18 years and is used to fund teachers, staff, classroom materials, student transportation and school operations. The second question seeks a renewal of the existing Capital Projects Levy that provides for school safety, building maintenance and technology. Since this is a renewal, it does not increase


taxes. Compared to neighboring school districts, these two levies are a modest ask that will go directly toward supporting students. The funding is crucial to help meet the needs of students and stabilize our high quality workforce. For more information, please visit our website at www.colheights.kl2.mn.us/2023referendum.

We are grateful for our supportive and caring community. We invite you to participate in District advisory councils, volunteer in schools, cheer on our teams, and attend a performance. Last year our graduating class received over \$279,000 in local scholarships. Key Club and National Honor Society students volunteer with a range of organizations in the area. #### Operating Levy:

- · Operating Levies support student learning by funding teachers and staff, classroom materials, student transportation and school operations.
- CHPS operating levy amount hasn't increased in 18 years.
- In 2023, taxes on an average priced home decreased by \$4.25 because of an expiring CHPS bond levy.
- If the operating levy passes, the monthly tax increase for property owners for this levy would be \$12. This is a total tax increase of \$7.75 per month from 2022 on an average priced home.
- This is a request of voters to increase taxes for the purpose of providing for the day to day costs of operating a school district. Operating levies include funding
  teachers, support staff, classroom materials and school operations. "Levies are for learning and bonds are for building" is a phrase that describes the difference
  between operating levies and bond referendums.

#### Capital Projects:

- · Capital Projects Levies are used for maintaining safety and security, providing district and student technology, and building maintenance. This is a levy renewal.
- This is a request of voters to increase taxes for the purpose of providing maintenance of district buildings and grounds including roofs, brick tuck pointing, case
  work, athletic facilities, windows and doors, plumbing, parking and drives, signage, siding, and mechanical systems. Additionally, Capital Projects Levy can be used
  for maintaining safety and security, providing district technology including acquisition, installation, replacement, support and maintenance of software, improved
  technology, technology systems, network and infrastructure, and related training.
- The 2014 voter approved Capital Projects Levy was to provide plumbing, roofing and other maintenance, along with an investment in educational technology.

#### Local #710 Teacher of the Year | Alyssa Isaacs

Columbia Heights Public Schools 3rd-grade teacher at North Park School for Innovation, Alyssa Isaacs, has been named the 2023 CHPS Local 710 Teacher of the Year. "I was very shocked and honored to hear that I was chosen," said Isaacs. "And my coworkers at North Park School for Innovation have definitely not let me win quietly, they have been cheering me on the whole time."

Isaacs started her tenure at CHPS in the corner of the NPSfl library, as she did not yet have a classroom. Since her start here in 2011, she has not only been a teacher, but also has helped with the ENCORE afterschool program, helped with Summer ENCORE, is on the NPSfl Equity Team and has served on several leadership committees.



"Our Teacher of the Year committee goes through teachers that are nominated every year by colleagues and demonstrate excellence in their school," said President of the Local 710 Teacher's Union, Karissa Ouren. "Alyssa's commitment to her students and equity through literacy is one of the many reasons she was chosen for this honor."

Part of the selection process includes an essay from each nominee. In Isaac's application essay, she states, "There are countless issues and challenges in our public education system today. But I believe that the lack of adequate literacy instruction in elementary schools is one of the greatest challenges facing both students and teachers. Equipping students with strong reading skills is also one of the most effective things we can do to combat poverty, racism and other inequities in the world." "Teaching in Columbia Heights and at North Park has been such a huge privilege," Isaacs said. "Heights is such a good example of a strong community that rallies around its students and staff. I have so many treasured friends and colleagues at North Park and have learned something important from each one of them."

Isaacs received her Bachelor's Degree in Elementary Education from Whitworth University in Spokane, WA and a Master's Degree in Literacy Education at Hamline University in St. Paul, MN. The award is sponsored by the Columbia Heights Federation of Teachers Local 710. With her selection, Isaacs will represent CHPS for next year's Minnesota Teacher of the Year award.

#### **Alumni of Distinction | Molly Lewis**

Columbia Heights High School (CHHS) alumni Molly Lewis (class of 1993) has been named her alma mater's 2023 Alumni of Distinction. Lewis was announced as the 15th recipient of this award during the CHHS Class of 2023 graduation ceremony.

"I'm very proud to be an alum of CHHS and honored to receive this award," stated Lewis when asked about receiving this award. "The energy, diversity and individuals in this community make Columbia Heights so wonderfully unique. I am just one of many parents, community members and staff trying to do what they can to ensure the best opportunities possible for our youth."



Lewis attended CHHS in the early 90s and participated in Girls Tennis, Girls Basketball, National Honor Society and the Patriots Marching Band, which was a collaboration high school marching band comprised of Fridley, Spring Lake Park, Saint Anthony and Columbia Heights high schoolers. She played clarinet and saxophone and was also a part of the color guard.

After graduation, Lewis attended Winona State University and received her degree to become a Social Worker. She has become an important part of the Columbia Heights community and Columbia Heights Public Schools. Lewis has worked as a social worker for Hennepin County, in Children and Family Services, for 26 years. Since 2005, she has had four children attend CHPS. Her sons graduated in 2018, 2020 and 2022 and her daughter will be a junior at CHHS this fall. Her oldest son, Keon, is now a 2nd-grade teacher at North Park School for Innovation.

Lewis spent much of her time in Columbia Heights coaching youth basketball, being a parent volunteer for CHPS schools and athletics, participating in CHPS advisory boards and committees, helping plan events at the schools and within the community, and much more. She decided to move her involvement with CHPS to a more official position when she ran for School Board, and became a CHPS Board of Education member in 2014, serving until 2022.

Columbia Heights Public Schools held ENCORE Environmental Camp from July 10-14! Environmental Camp is a field-trip focused program led by CHPS teachers. This free to CHPS students program included many activities including environmental learning, outdoor fun and community building games.

"These second through fifth grade students experienced a week-long environmental camp devoted to looking and listening, exploring and observing, and moving and letting loose," said Peg Nelson, one of the teachers who ran Environmental Camp. "We spent a lot of our time outside,



which can help promote better physical and mental health for our students!"

Each day during the week had a different location for students to explore and learn from. On the first day of camp, students were able to visit parks in Columbia Heights, as well as spending some time in the Blooming Heights Garden, and were joined by Columbia Heights Mayor, Amáda Márquez Simula. On the second day of camp, students went to the Wildlife Science Center to learn about local wildlife, including wolves, bears and different kinds of birds and reptiles.
